Your answer to this question helps us determine if you're eligible to claim certain dependantrelated deductions and credits on your return, including:



*Starting in 2017, the Canada caregiver amount has replaced the family caregiver amount, the infirm dependant credit, and the caregiver credit.

To be considered eligible, a dependant is typically someone who: • Is a child under 18, grandchild, parent, grandparent, brother, sister, niece, nephew, aunt, or uncle (of yourself or your spouse or common-law partner), or someone who is mentally or physically infirm • Is related to you by blood, marriage, or adoption · Lived with you in Canada in a home that you maintained Remember, if you share custody of your dependant with someone else, only one parent can claim the deductions mentioned above. Where do I claim this? Follow these steps in H&R Block's 2017 tax software: 1. Under the GET STARTED tab, click the ABOUT YOU icon then click the Your family link. 2.
